SUBJECT: Consideration of Amendment No. 10 to the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Budget

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board adopt Resolution No. 847 amending the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget and allow staff to realign revenues and reserves to maintain the proper balance in each fund.

Background

Amendment No. 10 realigns budget within and across programs, funds, projects, and budget categories. This amendment does not increase or decrease the total District budget.

Budget realignments include:

- \$145,927 in grants and aids transfers from Activity 221 Water Resource Development Projects to support the following:
 - \$115,927 to Activity 120 Research, Data Collection, Analysis and Monitoring for contracted services to support data collection relating to freshwater inflow into St. Joseph Bay from the Gulf County Canal.
 - o \$30,000 to Activity 230 Surface Water Projects for contractual services to provide stream debris-related hydrologic modeling.
- \$130,404 in contractual service transfers between projects within Activity 310 Land Management to provide funding in the appropriate project and support the preparation of district land management plans.
- \$125,000 in contractual service transfers from Activity 112 Minimum Flows and Minimum Water Levels to activity 150 Technology and Information Services across several budget categories to procure a high-performance computing system in support of the development and application of hydrologic models in the District's Minimum Flows and Minimum Water Levels (MFL) program. The amendment would provide up to \$100,000 for the system's hardware, \$20,000 for installation and implementation services, and \$5,000 for related software.

- \$4,881 in operating expense transfers from Activity 310 Land Management to Activity 370 Technology and Information Services to procure tablets and GPS units for Land Management staff to use in field operations.
- \$1,315 in operating expense transfers within Activity 330 Facilities for contractual services to provide budget for temporary staffing to maintain grounds at HQ, while a vacancy is under recruitment.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board:

- 1) Approve the bid submitted by Flatwoods Natives, Inc. for 1,000,000 longleaf pine tubelings in FY 2019-2020 at a total cost of \$140,000; and the price of \$140.00 per thousand for any additional tubelings ordered in FY 2019-2020, as well as for future longleaf pine tubeling orders in FY 2020-2021, FY 2021-2022, FY 2022-2023, and FY 2023-2024; and
- 2) Authorize the Executive Director to execute an agreement with Flatwoods Natives, Inc. for the purchase of 1,000,000 longleaf pine tubelings and the purchase (at the District's option and subject to Executive Director approval) of additional longleaf tubelings at the same price per thousand stated immediately above in Recommendation 1, subject to approval of funds for the longleaf tubelings in the District's FY 2019-2020 budget in September.

Background

In FY 2019-2020, staff anticipates restoring (reforesting) approximately 1,500 acres of cutover and/or disturbed longleaf pine habitat within the Econfina Creek and Chipola River Water Management Areas (WMA). To meet the planting needs for the 2019-2020 season, we will need to purchase approximately 1.2 million longleaf pine tubelings. The precise final acreage and longleaf pine tubeling figures will be determined in future months as timber harvests are completed. Although some of the FY 2019-2020 longleaf pine reforestation will occur on sites previously clearcut under standard timber sales, most of the reforestation work in the coming year will be on acreage that was impacted by Hurricane Michael and subsequently cleared through salvage timber harvests.

Under the proposed multi-year agreement, the District will annually amend the agreement to place the order for the upcoming planting season.

On February 1, 2019, the District issued an Invitation to Bid for prospective nursery vendors to grow, extract and supply the District with a minimum of 1,000,000 longleaf pine tubelings for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, and an undetermined amount of tubelings for the following four fiscal years at the same price per thousand tubelings.

On March 5, 2019, at 2:00 p.m. EST, the District received the following sealed bids for purchasing a minimum of 1,000,000 longleaf pine tubelings in FY 2019-2020.
