0067 to the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Budget

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board adopt Resolution No. 852 amending the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget and allow staff to realign revenues and reserves to maintain the proper balance in each fund.

Background

The three amendments for consideration realign budget within and across programs, funds, projects, and budget categories. Two of the three, No. 14 and a modification to Amendment No. 1 – EOG# O-0067, require approval from the Executive Office of the Governor (EOG), which was requested on July 2, 2019. Amendment No. 14 recognizes unanticipated revenues for damages sustained during Hurricane Michael; modifications to Amendment No. 1 allow for greater flexibility in responding to Hurriane Michael recovery efforts; and Amendment No. 15 consists of budget transfers in support of the other two.

Below are explanations for the amendments:

- No. 14 Recognize \$219,861 in unanticipated revenues for damages sustained during Hurricane Michael of which a portion will reduce the use of General Fund Balance Reserves with the remainder increasing the District's FY 2018-19 budget by \$208,731. Unanticipated revenues include:
 - \$91,759 from the District's insurer, Florida Municipal Insurance Trust, for property damage repairs at District Headquarters;
 - \$11,130 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and State of Florida for Category E Buildings and Equipment; and
 - \$116,972 from FEMA for Category B Emergency Protective Measures.

No. 15 Recognize \$79,371 in budget transfers of:

- \$68,241 within Activity 250 Facilities Construction and Major Renovations to provide Fixed Capital Outlay budget for property damage repairs at District Headquarters; and
- \$11,130 within Activity 113 Other Water Resources Planning in Salaries and Benefits and Overhead budget to allow for FEMA revenue of this amount to replace the use of General Fund balance reserves.

No. 1 – Modification

Expand the use of the \$1,000,000 approved in Amendment No. 1 - EOG #O-0067 for Hurricane Michael debris removal and disposal under the Contracted Services budget category to also cover repairs and replacement of assets within the District's Water Management Areas redistributing \$587,500 to additional budget categories of Operating Expense, Operating Capital Outlay, and Fixed Capital Outlay.

RESOLUTION NO. 852 AMENDMENT NUMBERS 14, 15, AND MODIFICATION TO 1 - EOG#O-0067 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019 BUDGET

WHEREAS, chapters 200 and 373, Florida Statutes, require the Governing Board of the Northwest Florida Water Management District (District) to adopt a final budget for each fiscal year; and

The budget is hereby amended as summarized in the memorandum dated July 10, 2019, requesting Amendments No. 14, 15, and modification to No. 1 - EOG# O-0067 to the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget. These amendments recognize new revenue and the reallocation of budget authority within and across programs, funds, projects, and budget categories to properly reflect activities performed and accurately assign actual costs with an increase to the total District budget.

2017 Devils Swamp Thinning Timber Sale

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize a 180-day extension of Agreement 17-032.

Background:

In February 2017 the District executed Agreement 17-032 with DeerPoint Timber Products, Inc. for the "Choctawhatchee River 2017 Devils Swamp Thinning Timber Sale." This timber sale involved an estimated 22,230 tons of pine timber products from 477 acres in southeast Walton County. These stands are delineated on the attached Exhibit Map A. The total estimated value of the timber was \$309,223 at the time of the timber sale with product prices of \$6.00 per ton for Pine Pulpwood; \$19.00 per ton for Pine Chip-n-Saw; and \$30.00 per ton for Pine Saw Timber.

On wetter sites such as the Devils Swamp tract, the District has historically set the term of timber harvest contracts at 18 months, in recognition of the fact that weather delays are likely to affect the timing of harvest operations. The contractor entered the site in April 2017 and harvested timber until early June 2017, when the site became too wet to continue harvesting without causing substantial resource impacts from logging operations. Dry conditions later in 2017 allowed the loggers to return for four weeks in November and December. In 2018, the site remained too wet for logging operations for the entire year, and Hurricane Michael wreaked havoc on the regional timber industry in October 2018. In 2019, timber market conditions and wet weather have caused further delays to this planned harvest. To date, 18,504 tons of timber has been harvested with total revenue to date of \$147,919.

Two 180-day extensions to the term of the agreement have been executed at the administrative level, extending the Agreement through August 5, 2019. The buyer, DeerPoint Timber Products, Inc., has requested an extension for an additional 180 days, with the hope that the

site will be dry enough during the area's typically dry fall months to allow for completion of the harvest.

State of Florida and District contracting laws and procedures allow for contract extensions when the reason for needing an extension is events beyond the control of the contractor.

Background

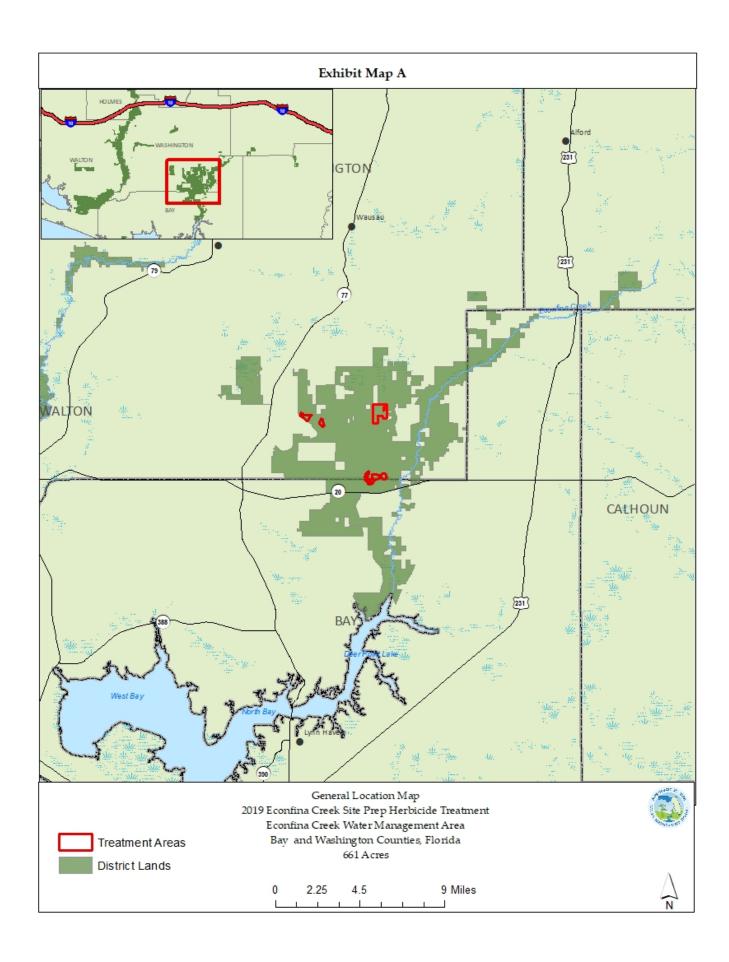
On June 13, 2019, the District issued an Invitation to Bid to prospective contractors to conduct aerial application of chemical herbicide for site preparation activities on District lands located within the Econfina Creek and Chipola River Water Management Areas (WMA) (see attached location map).

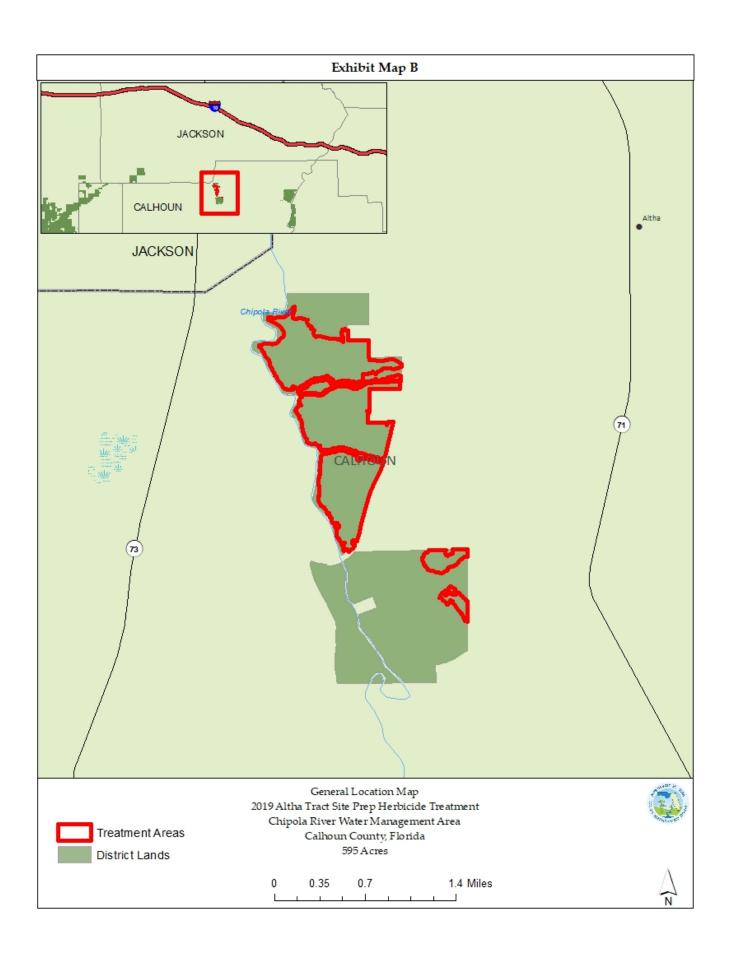
The project will treat five clearcut pine timber stands totaling 1,256 acres. Of this total, 661 acres of the work are within the Econfina Creek WMA and the remaining 595 acres are on the Altha tract of the Chipola River WMA. The site preparation activity involves aerial (helicopter) application of chemical herbicides on clearcut harvest sites to reduce upland oak and scrub vegetation competition in advance of longleaf pine planting activities that will occur in January and February 2020. The contractor will provide all herbicides and mixing agents required to complete the work in accordance with the District's specifications.

On July 9, 2019, at 2:00 p.m. EDT, the District opened six sealed bids in response to this Invitation to Bid. The bids received are listed below for your consideration.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Information Technology Purchases

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board approve the following procurements for Fiscal Year 2019-2020, contingent upon approval of the District's Fiscal Year 2019-2020 budget.

- Department of Management Services (DMS) competitively procured purchase of Internet access, telephony circuits, and security services for District headquarters, field offices, and connections to partner water management districts for DMS in the amount not to exceed \$90,000.
- Sole source purchase of annual support and licensing for Munis (accounting software from Tyler Technologies) in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.
- Sole source purchase of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) ARC GIS and ARC Online licensing, training, support, and consulting from Environmental Systems Research Institute (ESRI) in an amount not to exceed \$200,000.
- State of Florida contract purchase of Microsoft licensing for Microsoft Server and Workstation operating systems and software, SQL Database Server, SharePoint Server, Office 365 to Microsoft through an approved partner in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.

Background

The District's policies and procedures requires all purchases over \$65,000 be approved by the Governing Board. This includes, "multiple purchases with the same vendor for the same purpose, or within the same scope of work, each under \$65,000, but cumulatively is anticipated to exceed \$65,000 within the same fiscal year or across fiscal years." In addition to competitively procured purchases, the approval threshold was also made applicable to state term contracts.

The Information Technology Bureau actively pursues competing quotes from a wider range of vendors and considers possible alternative soulutions. This ensures that the District continues to get the best value for the taxpayers.

The Information Technology Bureau anticipates the following purchases:

- Internet access, telephony circuits, and security services from the Department of Management Services (DMS) SUNCOM Network. SUNCOM is established within DMS as the state enterprise telecommunications system. DMS competitively procures these services from multiple vendors i.e. Harris, AT&T, CenturyLink, Verizon to provide Internet access, telephony circuits, and security services for District headquarters, field offices, and connections to partner water management districts.
- Enterprise Resource Planning/Financial software named Munis from Tyler Technologies. Munis is the district's core business software for accounting, budget, general ledger, employee self-service, project accounting, purchase orders, requisitions, and administrative reporting. This solution was a originally a competitive procurement. Ongoing support, maintenance, and updates are purchased annually as a sole source through Tyler Technologies.
- Geographic Information Systems (GIS), training and consulting from Environmental Systems Research Institute, Inc. (ESRI), including ARC GIS, ARC Online, ARC Collector to provide geospatial data, maps, and applications to District staff and the public. ESRI has announced an intention to raise rates and will require the addition of a workflow module in order to use functionality for new mobile technologies. In addition, the District plans to maintain the level of participation in the ESRI Enterprise Advantage Program (EEAP) for maintenance and updates to meet anticipated needs at a reduced cost per unit.
- Microsoft licensing for Microsoft server and workstation operating systems and software including SQL database server, SharePoint Server, and Office 365 from the lowest price authorized reseller. Our current contract with Microsoft expires this year and the cost upon renewal is expected to be higher than last year.
