Potential mitigation for wetland impacts associated with road work on SR 71 (from SR 69/Pear Street in Blountstown north to the Calhoun/Jackson County Line), if required by federal and/or state permits, includes use of the Northwest Florida Water Management District In-Lieu Fee Mitigation Program, Tates Hell—Whiskey George/Sumatra Unit, UWRMP 5.5.9 (USACE approval of the NFWFMD ILF Instrument is pending).

If mitigation is necessary, it is anticipated that <1 UMAM credit would be required to offset this impact (the exact number of credits to be debited would be dictated by state and/or federal permits).

The Tates Hell—Whiskey George/Sumatra ledger has a current balance of 18.73 UMAM credits.

This mitigation option may potentially offset the impact in that (1) the impact is within the proposed ILF service area of the Tates Hell—Whiskey George/Sumatra project, (2) the impact and mitigation are within the same watershed (i.e., the Apalachicola River watershed), and (3) the mitigation is approximately “type-in-kind” (i.e., forested palustrine wetland impacts would be mitigated by forested palustrine credits).

This impact is not within the service area of any private mitigation bank.

When offsetting mitigation for a transportation project is necessary, it is the responsibility of FDOT (or other sponsor of the project) to propose mitigation to federal and/or state permitting authorities.
