for the Pine Island Water System Project Resulting from this Amendment

Amendment No. 3 to the Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-2015 District Budget transfers \$19,701 between programs, projects, funds, and budget categories to provide additional grant funding for the Pine Island Water System Project. This amendment does not increase or decrease the total District budget.

In February 2014, the Governing Board approved up to \$409,844 in grant funding assistance to the Calhoun County Board of County Commissioners for construction of a new water supply and distribution system for the Pine Island Community. Completion of this project is to provide urgently needed relief by replacing an inadequate and abandoned private system. Upon completion, the City of Blountstown will assume ownership and operation of the system in accordance with an existing interlocal agreement.

The project is under construction and estimated to be completed by February 2015. During the course of construction, the demand for residential connections to this system has increased such that the initial grant amount is insufficient. In November 2014, the County and its consultants worked to refine their cost estimates to address the additional demand. They had identified a tentative cost increase, which could be approved by the Governing Board in December without the District needing to amend the FY 2014-2015 operating expenditure budget. In December 2014, the Governing Board approved up to an additional \$17,000 in supplemental grant funding for this project. This budget amendment for \$19,701 reflects the amount required for the County to complete the residential connections. Total potential grant funding for this project is \$446,545.

### Recommendations

Staff recommends that the Governing Board approve Resolution No. 794 amending the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 Budget and allow staff to realign revenues and reserves to maintain the proper balance in each fund.

Staff also recommends the that the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to execute an amendment to the existing grant agreement with the Calhoun County Board of County Commissioners, providing up to \$19,701 in additional grant funding for the Pine Island Water System Project.

### **Recommendations:**

Staff recommends that the Governing Board approve the Maintenance Agreement between the Board of County Commissioners of Jackson County and the Northwest Florida Water Mangement District.

#### **Background:**

On January 10, 1995, the District entered into a 20-year Maintenance Agreement with the Board of County Commissioners of Jackson County for Christoff Landing, a local boat ramp on the Chipola River owned by the District. Christoff Landing was acquired in 1992 when the District purchased 7,378 acres from Mutual Life Insurance Company of New York along the Chipola River.

Through this Maintenance Agreement, the District has worked with Jackson County over the last 20 years to provide for the maintenance and management of this popular boat ramp and recreational facility. Currently, the site offers three primitive camp sites, a boat ramp, bank fishing, picnicking, canoeing, wildlife viewing and seasonal hunting. Through the proposed agreement, Jackson County will provide labor and equipment to assist the District in maintenance and repair of the boat launch and access route to the property, maintenance of the parking area adjacent to the boat launch, maintenance of the parking area adjacent to recreation areas, and general grounds maintenance of three primitive campsites and a pavilion. The District agrees to reimburse the County for materials used in such repairs and maintenance, not to exceed \$1,000 per year.

The Jackson County Board of County Commissioners approved this agreement at their December meeting.

This AGREEMENT is between the NORTHWWEST FLORIDA WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT, 81 Water Management Drive, Havana, Florida 32333-4712, hereinafter called "DISTRICT" and the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF JACKSON COUNTY, 2864 South Madison Street, Marianna, Florida 32446, hereinafter called "COUNTY".

# WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT is the owner in fee simple of certain lands located in Jackson County, Florida, hereinafter called the "Property", said Property being more particularly shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT is responsible for preserving and protecting the water resources of the Chipola River by preventing erosion and deterioration of water quality and for providing maintenance and management of recreation sites on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY desires to assist the DISTRICT in enhancing general public recreational opportunities along the Chipola River by undertaking management, maintenance and erosion prevention responsibilities for Christoff Landing;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises which are made a part of this Agreement and the mutual covenants, terms and conditions contained herein, the DISTRICT and the COUNTY agree as follows:

The COUNTY agrees to provide labor and equipment for the maintenance and repair of the recreation improvements located on the Property, including, but not limited to the boat launch, parking areas, primitive camp sites, picnic pavilion and other recreational facilities that might be agreed to by both parties. Such responsibility shall include, but not be limited to, the maintenance and repair of the boat launch and access route to the Property, maintenance of the parking area adjacent to the boat launch, maintenance of the parking area adjacent to recreation areas; general grounds maintenance of the three primitive campsites and pavilion, including litter pick up and removal; and the provision for such law enforcement services as are usual and customary in order to allow for the safe and orderly public utilization of the Property.

The DISTRICT agrees to reimburse the COUNTY for materials used in such repairs and maintenance as agreed to by the DISTRICT, not to exceed \$1,000.00 per year.

The COUNTY expressly understands and agrees that the Property and surrounding land, in addition to being a component of the Property, is also managed and operated as part of a Wildlife Management Area by the FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION, and all regulations and rules for management and operation of the Property and facilities shall be in conformance with the

rules and regulations, as may from time to time be amended, for operation and management of the Wildlife Management Area.

The COUNTY will use available funds to provide for trash receptacles and for regular trash removal. In the event such funds are not available, the DISTRICT may contract with a waste removal contractor for regular trash removal.

Subject to mutual agreement and to the availability of funds, the COUNTY and DISTRICT shall provide other ancillary facilities such as, but not limited to, picnic and recreational facilities, as may be deemed necessary or desirable by the COUNTY and DISTRICT. Amendment(s) to this Agreement will be required prior to commitment of District funds to such ancillary facilities. Upon completion of such other ancillary facilities, if any, COUNTY agrees to assume maintenance responsibility for same.

The COUNTY shall keep the Property and facilities maintained in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local health and safety standards and kept in good repair to prevent undue deterioration, provide for safe public use and prevent water quality degradation of the Chipola River.

The DISTRICT and COUNTY covenant that they have full legal authority to enter into this Agreement and to develop, operate and maintain Property, facilities and improvements in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

The DISTRICT reserves the right to prohibit or restrict access hours to boat launching facilities on the Property during periods of potential drought, flooding, fire hazard or other potential harm or disaster to said Property or wildlife.

The DISTRICT and COUNTY shall each furnish a contact person who shall be responsible for coordination and resolution of problems arising from this Maintenance Agreement.

The DISTRICT contact person shall be:

These contact persons or their representatives shall periodically jointly inspect the Property and, by mutual agreement, create work plans outlining needed development, maintenance and repair and improvement activities.

This Agreement is effective January 9, 2015 and shall remain in effect for a period of twenty (20) years from the date hereof, though it may be extended by written agreement between the parties.


This Agreement may be terminated by the COUNTY or the DISTRICT upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other. In the event of such termination, the obligations of the parties hereunder shall cease, and the Property and all improvements located on the Property shall revert to the exclusive control of the DISTRICT.

This Agreement contains the complete agreement between the DISTRICT and the COUNTY and, as of the effective date hereof, shall supersede all other relevant

agreements between the parties with respect to the Property; provided, however, the parties may mutually agree at any time by written instrument to make changes within the general scope of this Agreement.

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

North American Farms, LLC. (NAF) is requesting renewal and modification of Individual Water Use Permit (IWUP) No. 20000038 with increases in the average daily and maximum monthly withdrawal amounts. The requested increases are due to the addition of approximately 140 irrigated acres of spring planted cotton, corn, peanuts, and green beans, and fall plantings of rye, oats, and wheat to NAF's current spring and fall plantings listed below.

Staff utilized the Agricultural Field Scale Irrigation Requirements Simulation (AFSIRS) to estimate the irrigation demand associated with 140 acres of the described spring and fall plantings, in addition to NAF's current plantings. In order to accurately model irrigation demands, input parameters for AFSIRS include daily estimates of evapotranspiration, precipitation, crop type, and soil types. Staff estimates that the AFSIRS-derived withdrawal amounts are adequate to meet NAF's irrigation demands for the permit duration and recommends authorization of the AFSIRS-derived average daily and maximum monthly withdrawal amounts.

Staff used the analytical model DRAWDOWN to analyze potential impacts to the Floridan aquifer associated with the long-term withdrawal at the recommended average daily rate. The simulated drawdowns in the Floridan aquifer were 16 feet and 15 feet at distances of one-half mile and one mile, respectively, from the center of pumping. NAF's groundwater withdrawals represent an existing, long-term use of the Floridan aquifer, and some portion of the predicted drawdown has already occurred. No harm to water resources or existing legal users is anticipated to result from these drawdowns.

#### PERMIT APPLICATION REVIEW:

Section 373.223, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and section 40A-2.301, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), require an applicant to establish that the proposed use of water:

- (a) Is a reasonable-beneficial use;
- (b) Will not interfere with any presently existing legal use of water; and,
- (c) Is consistent with the public interest.

In addition, the above requirements are detailed further in the District's Water Use Permit Applicant's Handbook. District staff reviewed the water use permit application pursuant to the above-described requirements and have determined that the application meets the conditions for issuance of this permit.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is the determination of the staff that the water use amounts recommended, as conditioned, are reasonable-beneficial, consistent with the public's interest, and will not harm the water resources of the area or interfere with existing legal users. This determination has been made according to provisions of Chapter 373, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 40A-2, Florida Administrative Code.

Staff recommends that the applicant be granted an Individual Water Use Permit for an annual average daily withdrawal of 3.540 million gallons and a maximum monthly withdrawal of 251.200 million gallons of groundwater from the Floridan aquifer. Staff also recommends that the expiration date of the permit be January 1, 2035, and that the permit be conditioned as per the "Conditions for Issuance" included in Exhibit A of the permit document.

- 3. The Permittee shall include the Individual Water Use Permit number and the well's Florida Unique Well Identification Number (e.g. AAA8875) when submitting reports or otherwise corresponding with the District.
- 4. The Permittee shall annually evaluate the efficiency of each of its irrigation units and undertake necessary maintenance, repairs and upgrades to provide for the proper efficiency of its equipment. The Permittee shall maintain the irrigation system to prevent wasteful runoff from the property associated with irrigation.
- 5. The Permittee shall equip the well and irrigation system with an anti-siphoning device if chemicals are to be applied through the irrigation system, as required by section 487.064, F.S.
- 6. The Permittee, prior to the construction, alteration and/or enhancement of any surface water withdrawal, diversion, or management system, shall contact the District to determine if a permit will be required. A permit would be required by the District for activities including creek sandbagging, sump excavation, and any maintenance beyond that considered routine or custodial.
- 7. The Permittee, by January 31 of each year, shall submit a water use report for the previous calendar year (January December), even if no water is used. The Permittee shall record the data required on Water Use/Pumpage Report (Form 166). The Permittee, if preferred, may submit the report electronically by downloading the correct form from the District website, filling it out properly, and e-mailing it to <a href="mailto:compliance@nwfwater.com">compliance@nwfwater.com</a>. The next report is due by January 31, 2015.

- 8. The Permittee shall submit to the District in a single electronic submittal the following information by January 31, April 30, July 31 and October 31 of each year:
  - a. Static water level measurements conducted during the first two weeks of the above months for Floridan production wells NAF #2 (AAA8887), NAF #7 (AAA8881), NAF #9 (AAA8873), NAF #16 (AAD9037) and NAF #17 (AAF8395) using a District-approved water level measuring device. Water levels shall be taken following a 24-hour non-pumping period, as much as is practicable, reported as depth-to-water below a pre-defined measuring point. All measurements shall be taken from the same measuring point. If the measuring point is different from land surface elevation, then the Permittee shall provide the measuring point distance above or below land surface. All static water level reports shall include the date and time the well was turned off, date and time the measurement was taken, method and device used, and the water level measurement to 0.01 foot for steel/electric tape and 1.0 foot precision for airline methods, respectively. The Permittee, if utilizing the airline method, shall also report airline length, gauge reading, linear distance of the airline terminus from land surface, and a description of where the airline terminates (e.g. land surface, pump base, pressure gauge, etc.).

The Permittee may submit the report electronically via digital media or, if preferred, by e-mailing it to <a href="mailto:compliance@nwfwater.com">compliance@nwfwater.com</a>. The Permittee, at the time of modification or renewal, shall submit a summary and analysis of the water level data collected for the wells for the entire period of record.

- 9. The Permittee shall install and maintain in-line, totalizing flow meters on all production wells. The meters shall be maintained to be at least 95% accurate and any meter determined defective must be replaced within 30 days of its discovery. The Permittee, within 30 days of well completion or completion of project construction, shall provide documentation to the District that the required flow meters have been installed and report the initial meter readings.
- 10. The Permittee, by October 31, in years 2019, 2024, 2029 and at the time of requesting a permit modification or renewal, shall submit documentation of the flow meter calibration and accuracy rating to the District using the Flow Meter Accuracy Report Form (Form 170). The Permittee, if preferred, may submit the report electronically by downloading the correct form from the District website, filling it out properly, and e-mailing it to <a href="mailto:compliance@nwfwater.com">compliance@nwfwater.com</a>.
- 11. The Permittee, by January 31 of each year, shall submit a status report using Form 168, Annual Crop Summary Report Form. The report shall include: Type and acreage of crop(s) planted and irrigated; Type(s) of irrigation system(s); and the number of livestock being watered.
- 12. The Permittee shall ensure that any new irrigation system(s) purchased is/are of an efficiency rating of 90% or greater.
- 13. The Permittee, by October 1, 2019, 2024, and 2029 shall provide a description of water conservation and efficiency measures currently implemented or planned to be implemented during the permit duration to minimize groundwater and surface water withdrawals. Measures may include, but are not limited to: Irrigation system evaluation using the Mobile Irrigation Lab (MIL); Irrigation systems upgrades to improve efficiency; improvements to the operation and management of irrigation

- systems; enhancing reuse and recycling; limiting irrigation to early morning or evening hours to minimize evaporative losses; and other Best Management Practices.
- 14. The Permittee shall maximize the use of reclaimed water if it is available and its use is environmentally, economically and technically feasible.
- 15. The Permittee shall mitigate impacts that interfere with existing legal users of Floridan aquifer groundwater. Mitigation may include modification of the Permittee's pumping schedule (i.e., duration, withdrawal rates, time of day, etc.), the lowering of the affected pump(s) or the replacement of the well(s) including proper plugging and abandonment of the well(s) that is replaced. The Permittee, upon receipt of an allegation of interference, shall retain the services of an appropriate licensed professional to investigate the alleged interference. The Permittee shall ensure their chosen professional investigates any alleged interference within 48 hours of the allegation being made and provides the conclusions of the investigation to the entity alleging the impact within 72 hours of the allegation being made. If it is determined that the use of a well has been impaired as a result of the Permittee's operation, the Permittee shall undertake the required mitigation. The Permittee shall be responsible for the payment of services rendered by the licensed professional. The Permittee, within 30 days of any allegation of interference, shall submit a report to the District including the date of the allegation, the name and contact information of the party making the allegation, the result of the investigation made, and any mitigation action undertaken.
