Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to execute an agreement or an amendment to the current agreement for continuation of the Integrated Water Resources Monitoring program with a contract amount of up to \$150,000 for the period of July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024.

Background

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) created the Integrated Water Resources Monitoring program in 1996: a multi-resource, comprehensive, integrated program to monitor surface water and groundwater quality. The District has participated in the program since its inception. The large volume of water quality data produced has supported timely, accurate assessment of the quality of the District's water resources. This data is available to the public through DEP's water quality databases.

This contract consists of two projects for the collection of surface water and groundwater quality data from sites across the District.

- The Water Quality Status Project consists of the annual collection of 85 samples from five resource types: confined aquifers, rivers, large lakes, streams, and unconfined aquifers. A new set of random sample sites are selected for each resource every year.
- The Groundwater Quality Temporal Variability Project involves monthly sampling of seven wells and one first magnitude spring at five fixed monitoring locations and is designed to track water quality changes over time.

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection will compensate the District up to \$150,000 for this data collection on a fee schedule/cost reimbursement basis.

RESOLUTION NO. 922 TO THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION FOR THE BATTEN TRACT ACQUISITION; ECONFINA SPRINGS GROUNDWATER CONTRIBUTION AREA

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the Northwest Florida Water Management District (hereinafter referred to as the "District") has the duty and responsibility under Chapter 373, Florida Statutes, for the management of water and related land resources and for preservation of natural resources, fish and wildlife; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature provided funds to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection for distribution to the Northwest Florida Water Management District in Fiscal Year 2015-2016 General Appropriations Act, line item 1639 (General Revenue and LATF), Fiscal Year 2017-2018 General Appropriations Act, line item 1606 (LATF) and Fiscal Year 2019-2020 General Appropriations Act, Section 61 (LATF), created pursuant to section 375.041, Florida Statutes, for land acquisition of properties for springs restoration, protection and management; and







SUBJECT:	Overview of Payment in Lieu of Taxes for 2022

Section 373.59, Florida Statutes, requires the District to make Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) annually on District land purchases to qualifying counties. The payment reflects the ad valorem tax losses incurred as a result of these purchases. A county qualifies if its population is 150,000 people or fewer. Since 1992 and including this calendar year, the District will have paid \$2.139 million to qualifying counties.

SUBJECT:	Consideration of Inflationary Pay Increase

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board approve a 5% inflationary pay increase for District Full-Time Equivalent positions.

Background

The State of Florida's General Appropriations Act is expected to be signed into law by Governor DeSantis in June, 2023. Within the state budget, effective July 1, 2023, is a 5% salary increase for state employees to address elevated inflation and provide a competitive pay adjustment.

Historically, when these pay increases have occurred, the state's five water management districts have followed what the state has done. Additionally, staff have determined these increases could be absorbed within the District's current-year budget. Therefore, in order to be consistent with the state and contingent on this provision becoming law, staff recommend implementing the 5% inflationary pay increase effective July 1, 2023.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board approve extending the grant agreement for the Bay County North Bay Wastewater Reuse Project to December 31, 2024.

Discussion

In 2017, the Governing Board awarded \$500,000 in grant funding to Bay County for construction of the North Bay Wastewater Reuse Project. The project was developed as a cooperative effort between Bay County and Gulf Power Company to install approximately six miles of wastewater reuse line from the North Bay Wastewater Treatment Facility to Gulf Power's Lansing Smith Electric Generating Plant. In 2020, the Governing Board approved a request to extend the agreement end date to December 31, 2021.

In October 2021, the Florida Power and Light Company (FPL, the successor to Gulf Power for the Lansing Smith facility) informed Bay County that it determined reclaimed water is no longer a preferred source of cooling water for the plant and that FPL will not proceed with its role in construction of the project. The Governing Board subsequently approved the County's request to extend the agreement to June 30, 2023, to allow additional time for engineering, permitting, and construction.

Since 2021, the County has developed a revised concept for moving forward with the project to serve County facilities and other uses within the County. Additionally, Bay County has worked with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection to address associated permit requirements for the North Bay Wastewater Treatment Facility. To support the engineering and permitting needed for the revised scope of work and to allow additional time for construction, the County has requested that the District extend the associated grant agreement through December 31, 2024.



On December 8, 2022, the Blueprint Intergovernmental Agency (Blueprint) presented information and requested authorization to construct a shared-use trail across District-owned property in Leon County, Florida.

The requested shared-use trail is a segment of the Lake Jackson Greenway. The Lake Jackson Greenway creates a multimodal connection from Lake Ella to Lake Jackson Mounds Archaeological State Park by providing sidewalks, trails, shared-use paths for bicyclists, pedestrians, and other non-motorized users, thereby connecting neighborhoods to several existing parks and destinations.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board accept this memo and the available report on the East Region Land Management Plan Reviews as the report on land management review team findings.

Background

The District is required by section 373.591, F.S., to establish management review teams that conduct periodic reviews to determine whether District lands are being managed for the purposes for which they were acquired and in accordance with land management objectives. By October 1 of each year, the District is to provide its governing board with a report indicating which properties have been reviewed and the review team's findings.

The District has three land management plans in place as well as restoration plans for eight sites used for mitigation. These include:

Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank (Washington County). The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) provides the District an annual report on the wildlife management activities and results for the Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank. In addition, comprehensive semi-annual and annual monitoring reports describe the results of quantitative vegetation sampling and wildlife occurrence on site. Site inspections for compliance and habitat quality are conducted annually by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) and Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) in conjunction with a mitigation review team (MRT) consisting of representatives of the FWC, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Florida Department of Transportation, National Marine Fisheries Service, and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The District's mitigation program also has detailed, active mitigation plans for seven additional projects on other District-owned lands. Although not typical land management plans, the mitigation plans are more robust in their nature. These mitigation plans were approved by the ACOE, FDEP and MRT as described above. The mitigation plans are inspected and monitored at least annually and reviewed by District staff every six months for compliance with restoration and management goals. The periodicity of monitoring reports varies based on permit requirements. Most sites are monitored twice for the first year and annually thereafter.

East Region (Chipola River, Apalachicola River, and Elinor Klapp-Phipps Park). The East Region Land Management Plan was adopted by the Governing Board on September 26, 2019.

- Elinor Klapp-Phipps Park and E. Guy Revell, Jr. Nature Trail Conservation Area was reviewed on October 26, 2022.
- Apalachicola River WMA and Chipola River WMA were reviewed on April 29 and April 30, 2023.

West Region (Perdido River, Escambia River, Blackwater River, Yellow River, and Garcon Point). The West Region Land Management Plan was adopted by the Governing Board on June 25, 2020. Below is the tentative schedule for the West Region reviews.

- Garcon Point WMA and Blackwater River WMA first quarter of 2024
- Yellow River WMA second quarter of 2024
- Perdido River WMA third quarter of 2024
- Escambia River WMA fourth quarter of 2024

Central Region (Econfina Creek and Choctawhatchee River). The Central Region Land Management Plan was adopted by the Governing Board on December 9, 2021. The Central Region reviews will be scheduled for 2026.
