Trustees to Continue Support for the Sod-Based Crop Rotation System

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to execute an agreement with the University of Florida Board of Trustees to continue support for implementation of sod-based crop rotation for Fiscal Years 2023-24, 2024-25, and 2025-26, with a maximum total compensation not to exceed \$160,000 and estimated annual amounts of \$40,000 in FY 2023-24, \$60,000 in FY 2024-25, and \$60,000 in FY 2025-26, subject to approval of the budget for each fiscal year.

Background

The District began funding research to determine the benefits of sod-based rotation in 2005. Documented benefits of the practice include higher crop yields at a lower cost and reduced impacts on the quality and quantity of surface and groundwater resources. The University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (IFAS) has been researching this system in Gadsden and Jackson counties since 2000 and has demonstrated achievement of more than a 60% reduction in irrigation demand, a 50% reduction in nitrogen demand, and up to a 40% increase in crop yields. District funding contributes to staffing and operational expenses and has historically ranged between \$37,000 and \$64,000 annually.


Background:


Escambia River Electric Cooperative, Inc. (EREC) has requested a 30-foot wide Right-of-Way Easement for general communication and commercial public telecommunication purposes, being located on District land in Sections 10 and 11, Township 5 North, Range 30 West, Santa Rosa County in the Escambia River Water Management Area (see attached maps) within an existing powerline easement.

In 2012, the District's Governing Board approved the relocation of a transmission line located in Section 10 to PowerSouth Energy Cooperative. The easement request in Section 10 would be located on land the District received from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) in 1994 as a donation. Because FDOT was mitigating for impacts of certain road projects, this land is also encumbered by a conservation easement to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP). The conservation easement states that uses generally associated with rights of way, such as a utility corridor, are permitted. In 2012, FDOT indicated that as long as there were no permanent impacts to the conservation easement, it had no issue with the proposed PowerSouth Energy Cooperative easement relocation. At that time, District legal counsel also concurred that

the relocation was within the terms of the conservation easement and concurs that the current request is within the terms of the conservation easement. Staff checked with FDEP regarding the current easement request and received approval of the proposed easement in Section 10. The land in Section 11 was purchased from Champion International Corporation in 1994 and is not encumbered with a Conservation Easement.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Three Grant Donations for Reforestation and Habitat

Enhancement Efforts on District lands

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to execute an agreement with The Arbor Day Foundation to receive a reimbursable grant in an amount up to \$141,984.00 to support District reforestation efforts; approve a grant donation of up to \$30,000.00 from The Nature Conservancy to support labor costs associated with reforestation efforts; and approve a grant donation from the National Wild Turkey Federation in an amount up to \$60,000.00 to support prescribed burning and sand pine eradication efforts..

Background

The Arbor Day Foundation provides grant funding for various types of tree-planting programs throughout the U.S., including resource-restoration efforts at the District.

In 2022, the District applied for and was awarded \$269,396.82 to plant 1,282,842 trees within the Econfina Creek and Chipola River water management areas. Subject to approval of this agreement from the Governing Board, this fiscal year's grant award will provide up to \$141,984.00 for the purchase and installation of 550,000 longleaf pine tubelings within the Apalachicola River, Chipola River, Econfina Creek and Perdido River water management areas.

As a member of the Apalachicola Regional Stewardship Alliance, the District regularly receives support and resources from The Nature Conservancy. Upon approval from the Governing Board, this will allow the District to receive a donation of up to \$30,000.00 toward labor costs associated with tree planting in support of the District's reforestation efforts.

The National Wild Turkey Federation provides grant funding assistance through the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission to support wildlife habitat conservation and

enhancement projects throughout Florida. Upon approval from the Governing Board, this will allow the District to receive a grant donation of up to \$60,000.00 toward contract prescribed burning of 902 acres in the Choctawhatchee River WMA and the eradication of 281 acres of sand pine within the Econfina Creek WMA. Both projects will provide significant habitat improvement for the wild turkey.

Together, the above grant donation programs will provide a total of \$231,984.00 in support of the District's resource restoration program.

DESCRIPTION:

South Juniper Properties, LLC (SJP) requests modification of Individual Water Use Permit (IWUP) No. 2E-013-305502-1 for an increase to the currently permitted withdrawal amounts from the surficial and Floridan aquifers for agricultural use due to an increase in farmed acres.

SJP is currently permitted to irrigate 393.27 acres of sod, wet and harvest 47.34 acres of bahia grass in the spring and fall, provide potable water to six employees, and utilize water for other minor uses (chemical mixing/spraying and equipment washdown). SJP plans to increase the irrigated acreage to 775.44 acres of sod, and wet and harvest 124.23 acres of bahia grass in the spring and fall while continuing to provide potable water to six employees, and utilize water for other minor uses (chemical mixing/spraying and equipment washdown). Floridan aquifer water will be used for the irrigation of sod, grass harvesting, and minor potable use. Surficial aquifer water will be used for other minor uses.

Staff used the Agricultural Field Scale Irrigation Requirements Simulation (AFSIRS) to determine the irrigation demand associated with 775.44 acres of sod. Water needs for employees is based on the Water Use Permit Applicant's Handbook, and other water needs are based on application documents. Staff recommends authorization of the AFSIRS derived amounts added to the water need for grass harvesting, employees, and other minor uses.

District staff used the program DRAWDOWN to analyze potential impact to the Floridan aquifer associated with the average daily withdrawal over the 20-year permit period. Drawdowns of approximately 11.2 feet and 10.2 feet were simulated at distances of one-half mile and one mile, respectively, from the center of pumping. The minor water uses from the surficial aquifer and the Floridan aquifer drawdowns are not anticipated to interfere with existing legal uses.

PERMIT APPLICATION REVIEW:

Section 373.223, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and section 40A-2.301, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), require an applicant to establish that the proposed use of water:

- (a) Is a reasonable-beneficial use;
- (b) Will not interfere with any presently existing legal use of water; and,
- (c) Is consistent with the public interest.

In addition, the above requirements are detailed further in the District's Water Use Permit Applicant's Handbook. District staff have reviewed the water use permit application pursuant to the above-described requirements and have determined that the application meets the conditions for issuance of this permit.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is the determination of the staff that the water use amounts recommended, as conditioned, are reasonable-beneficial, consistent with the public's interest, and will not interfere with any presently existing legal use of water. This determination has been made according to provisions of Chapter 373, F.S., and Chapter 40A-2, F.A.C.

Staff recommends that the applicant be granted an Individual Water Use Permit for an average annual withdrawal of 1.502 million gallons per day (109.7 million gallons per month maximum) of groundwater from the Floridan aquifer for agricultural use and an average annual withdrawal of 8,900 gallons per day (0.270 million gallons per month maximum) of groundwater from the surficial aquifer for agricultural use. Staff also recommends that the expiration date of the permit remain August 1, 2042, and that the permit be conditioned as per the "Conditions for Issuance" included in Exhibit A of the permit document.

Specific Conditions

- 1. This permit shall expire on August 1, 2042.
- 2. This Permit authorizes the Permittee to make an average annual withdrawal of 1.502 million gallons per day (109.7 million gallons per month maximum) of groundwater from the Floridan aquifer for agricultural use and an average annual withdrawal of 8,900 gallons per day (0.270 million gallons per month maximum) of groundwater from the surficial aquifer for agricultural use. The individual facilities authorized to make this combined withdrawal are shown in the table below in the following condition. The total combined amounts of water withdrawn by all facilities listed shall not exceed the amounts identified above.

- 4. The Permittee shall include the Individual Water Use Permit number and the well's Florida Unique Identification Number (e.g. AAR6071 for SJP #1) when submitting reports or otherwise corresponding with the District.
- 5. The Permittee, by January 31 of each year, shall submit a water use report of total water usage for the previous calendar year (January December), even if no water is used. The Permittee shall record the data required on Water Use Summary Reporting Form (Form 172). The Permittee, if preferred, may submit the report electronically by downloading the correct form from the District website, filling it out properly, and e-mailing it to compliance@nwfwater.com. The next report is due by January 31, 2024.
- 6. The Permittee, by January 31 of each year, shall submit a status report using Form 168, Annual Crop Summary Report Form. The report shall include: type and acreage of crop(s) planted and irrigated; type(s) of irrigation system(s); and the number of livestock being watered.

- 7. Upon completion or conversion of the well (whichever occurs first), the Permittee shall install and maintain, in working order, an in-line totalizing flow meter at the well head on production well SJP #5. The Permittee shall maintain, in working order, in-line totalizing flow meters at the well heads on production wells SJP #1, SJP #2, SJP #3, and SJP #4. The meters shall be maintained to be at least 95% accurate and any meter determined defective must be replaced within 30 days of its discovery. The Permittee, within 30 days of meter installation/well completion, shall provide documentation to the District that the required flow meters have been installed and report the initial meter readings.
- 8. The Permittee, by October 31, in years 2027, 2032, 2037, and at the time of requesting a permit modification or renewal, shall submit documentation of the flow meter calibration and accuracy ratings for all flow meters to the District using the Flow Meter Accuracy Report Form (Form 170). The Permittee, if preferred, may submit the report electronically by downloading the correct form from the District website, filling it out properly, and e-mailing it to compliance@nwfwater.com.
- 9. The Permittee, by October 31, 2027, 2032, and 2037, shall provide a description of water conservation and efficiency measures currently implemented or planned to be implemented during the permit duration to minimize groundwater and surface water withdrawals. Measures may include, but are not limited to: irrigation system evaluation using the Mobile Irrigation Lab (MIL); irrigation systems upgrades to improve efficiency; improvements to the operation and management of irrigation systems; enhancing reuse and recycling; limiting irrigation to early morning or evening hours to minimize evaporative losses; and other Best Management Practices.
- 10. The Permittee shall maximize the use of surface water and/or stormwater prior to the use of groundwater. The Permittee shall also maximize the use of groundwater from the surficial aquifer wells prior to the use of groundwater from the Floridan aquifer wells.
- 11. The Permittee shall submit to the District in a single electronic submittal the following information by January 31, April 30, July 31 and October 31 of each year:
 - Static water level measurements for monitor wells OW #4, OW #8, and OW #9 conducted during the first two weeks of each month for the previous three months (e.g. measurements for January, February, and March shall be submitted by April 30) using a District-approved water level measuring device. Water levels shall be taken following a 24-hour non-pumping period, as much as is practicable, reported as depth-to-water below a pre-defined measuring point. All measurements shall be taken from the same measuring point. If the measuring point is different from land surface elevation, then the Permittee shall provide the measuring point distance above or below land surface. All static water level reports shall include the date and time the well was turned off, date and time the measurement was taken, method and device used, and the water level measurement to 0.01 foot for steel/electric tape and 1.0 foot precision for airline methods, respectively. The Permittee, if utilizing the airline method, shall also report airline length, gauge reading, linear distance of the airline terminus from land surface, and a description of where the airline terminates (e.g. land surface, pump base, pressure gauge, etc.).
- 12. The Permittee shall annually evaluate the efficiency of each of its irrigation units and undertake necessary maintenance, repairs and upgrades to provide for the proper efficiency of its equipment. The Permittee shall maintain and repair the irrigation system to avoid the inefficient use of or loss of water through pipe leaks, broken sprinkler heads, and clogged emitters. The Permittee shall maintain the irrigation system to prevent wasteful runoff from the property associated with irrigation.
- 13. The Permittee shall equip the well and irrigation system with an anti-siphoning device if chemicals are to be applied through the irrigation system, as required by section 487.064, F.S.

- 14. The Permittee, prior to the construction, alteration and/or enhancement of any surface water withdrawal, diversion, or management system, shall contact the District to determine if a permit will be required. A permit would be required by the District for activities including creek sandbagging, sump excavation, and any maintenance beyond that considered routine or custodial.
- 15. The Permittee shall ensure that any new irrigation system(s) purchased is/are of an efficiency rating of 90% or greater.
- 16. The Permittee shall maximize the use of reclaimed water if it is available and its use is environmentally, economically and technically feasible.

Standard Conditions

- 17. All water uses authorized by this permit shall be implemented as conditioned by this permit, including any documents incorporated by reference in a permit condition. The District may revoke this permit, in whole or in part, or take enforcement action, pursuant to sections 373.136 or 373.243, F.S., unless a permit modification has been obtained to address the noncompliance.
- 18. The Permittee shall immediately notify the District in writing of any previously submitted information that is later discovered to be inaccurate.
- 19. This permit does not convey to the Permittee any property rights or privileges other than those specified herein, nor relieve the Permittee from complying with any applicable local government, state, or federal law, rule, or ordinance.
- 20. The Permittee shall notify the District in writing within 45 days of any sale, transfer, or conveyance of ownership or any other loss of permitted legal control of the project and/or related facilities from which the permitted water use is made. Where Permittee's control of the land subject to the permit was demonstrated through a lease, the Permittee must either submit documentation showing that it continues to have legal control or transfer control of the permitted system/project to the new landowner or new lessee. All transfers of ownership are subject to the requirements of section 40A-2.351, F.A.C. Alternatively, the Permittee may surrender the water use permit to the District, thereby relinquishing the right to conduct any activities under the permit.
- 21. Nothing in this permit should be construed to limit the authority of the District to declare a water shortage and issue orders pursuant to Chapter 373, F.S. In the event of a declared water shortage, the Permittee must adhere to the water shortage restrictions, as specified by the District. The Permittee is advised that during a water shortage, reports shall be submitted as required by District rule or order.
- 22. With advance notice to the Permittee, District staff with proper identification shall have permission to enter, inspect, observe, collect samples, and take measurements of permitted facilities to determine compliance with the permit conditions and permitted plans and specifications. The Permittee shall either accompany District staff onto the property or make provision for access onto the property.
- 23. The Permittee may seek modification of any term of an unexpired permit. The Permittee is advised that section 373.239, F.S., and section 40A-2.331, F.A.C., are applicable to permit modifications.
- 24. The District reserves the right to curtail permitted withdrawal and diversion rates if the withdrawal or diversion causes harm to legal uses of water, offsite land use, or water resources and associated environmental features that existed at the time of permit application.

- 25. The Permittee shall not cause harmful saltwater intrusion. The District reserves the right to curtail permitted withdrawal rates if withdrawals cause harmful saline water intrusion.
- 26. The Permittee's consumptive use of water as authorized by this permit shall not reduce a flow or level below any minimum flow or level established by the District or the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to sections 373.042 and 373.0421, F.S. If the Permittee's use of water causes or contributes to such a reduction, then the District shall modify or revoke the permit, in whole or in part, unless the Permittee implements all provisions applicable to the Permittee's use in a District-approved recovery or prevention strategy.
- 27. The Permittee shall mitigate any harm caused by withdrawals or diversions permitted herein on legal water uses, offsite land use, and water resources and associated environmental features which existed at the time of permit application. Mitigation may include modification of the Permittee's pumping schedule (i.e., duration, withdrawal rates, time of day, etc.), the lowering of the affected pump(s) or the replacement of the well(s) including proper plugging and abandonment of the well(s) that is replaced. The Permittee, upon receipt of an allegation of interference, shall retain the services of an appropriate licensed professional to investigate the alleged interference. The Permittee shall ensure their chosen professional investigates any alleged interference within 48 hours of the allegation being made and provides the conclusions of the investigation to the entity alleging the impact within 72 hours of the allegation being made. If it is determined that the use of a well has been impaired as a result of the Permittee's operation, the Permittee shall complete the required mitigation within 30 days. The Permittee shall be responsible for the payment of services rendered by the licensed professional. The Permittee, within 30 days of any allegation of interference, shall submit a report to the District including the date of the allegation, the name and contact information of the party making the allegation, the result of the investigation made, and any mitigation action undertaken.

1. Michael Lee vs. Northwest Florida Water Management District, Walton County Circuit Court Case No. 2023-CA-000266

This is a personal injury suit brought by Michael Lee, plaintiff. The Plaintiff alleges that he was riding his bicycle on September 28, 2022, when he was struck and injured by a District vehicle. The complaint was filed in March 2023 and served on June 19, 2023. The complaint was forwarded to the District's liability insurance carrier and a claim was made. The insurance carrier has retained the Coppins Monroe law firm in Tallahassee as defense counsel for the District.

Through defense counsel, the District has answered the complaint, denied the allegations, and raised affirmative defenses and has served initial discovery (interrogatories and request for production) on the plaintiff. Responses to the District's discovery requests have been received by defense counsel. Defense counsel has set the plaintiff's deposition for January 11, 2024. The Court has not set a trial date or any other deadlines at this time.

2. William G. Merryman, Petitioner, Petition for Declaratory Statement

This petition for declaratory statement was filed with the District in accordance with Section 120.565, Florida Statutes, on October 2, 2023. In the petition, the petitioner the opinion of the District regarding the interpretation of Rule 62-330.301, F.A.C., Environmental Resource Permit Applicant's Handbook Volume I, s. 373.430, Fla. Stat., and s. 373.219, Fla. Stat. The petitioner apparently owns property in Clay County, Florida, which he contends is impacted by a project permitted by the St. Johns River Water Management District. Similar, if not identical, petitions appear to have been filed in each water management district and in DEP.

The District has 90 days within which to issue its statement or deny the petition. The petition and surrounding circumstances are under review.

3. William G. Merryman, petitioner vs. St. Johns River Water Management District, England-Thims & Miller, Loblolly Partners, LLC, Alterra Group, LLC, Lyndsay Keller, Esq., Lewis Ritter, Esq., and William Pyburn, respondents Petition for Administrative Hearing

This petition seeks a hearing on the previously filed Petition for Declaratory Statement filed by the same Petitioner. A petitioner for declaratory statement is not entitled to a hearing. Consequently, this petition has been dismissed without prejudice.
