## Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board approve the contract renewal with Environ Services, Inc. for janitorial services at District Headquarters and authorize the Executive Director to execute a three-year amendment with Environ Services, Inc. in the amount of \$77,850.00 for a period starting October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2027, subject to legal counsel review.

### **Background**

On July 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021, the District issued an Invitation to Bid (21B-011) to prospective contractors to conduct janitorial services for the District's Headquarters Facility.

On August 24, 2021, the District received four sealed bids in response to the Invitation to Bid. Environ Services, Inc. submitted the lowest bid (\$74,850.00) to conduct the specified services from October 1, 2021, through September 30, 2024. The ITB and agreement provided for an option to renew for an additional three-year period, starting October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2027. The three-year price for the renewal is \$25,950.00 per year for a total of \$77,850 for the three-year period.

Procured under RFP 22-001 and Delegation of Spending Authority for Prescribed Burning and Vegetation Management Services for FY 2024-25

## Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to renew the following Prescribed Burning and Vegetation Management Agreements for an additional three-year term, expiring on October 31, 2027:

- 22-032 Attack One Fire Management Services, Inc.
- 22-034 B&B Dugger, Inc.
- 22-035 Wildlands Service, Inc.

Staff also recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to issue individual or cumulative task orders that exceed the delegated spending authority to Attack-One Fire Management Services, Inc., B&B Dugger, Inc., and Wildlands Service, Inc. for prescribed burning and vegetation management services procured through RFP 22-001, subject to Governing Board approval of the Fiscal Year 2024-25 budget and legal counsel review.

### **Background**

The District currently has contracts with Attack-One Fire Management Services, Inc., B&B Dugger, Inc., and Wildlands Service, Inc. for prescribed burning and vegetation management services. These are three-year contracts which expire October 31, 2024. The agreements have an option for a three-year renewal term, which if renewed by the District, would expire on October 31, 2027.

The District relies heavily on these contractors to accomplish the majority of its annual prescribed burning and vegetation management goals and objectives each year. These three contractors have all completed previous work according to the terms of the agreements. The

three contractors have also agreed to honor their per acre ceiling rates as originally submitted under RFP 22-001.

During FY 2024-25, it is anticipated the contractors will each be awarded work on an individual or cumulative basis that exceeds the \$65,000 spending threshold under the Executive Director's authority. Because these are routine work orders issued at various times throughout the year, staff is requesting the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to issue task orders for prescribed burning and vegetation management that exceed the cumulative and individual thresholds under his standard spending authority.

The contracts with these companies utilize a competitive quote process and task order system to assign the work activities by the Division of Asset Management. Work would only be assigned up to the amount budgeted for these services in a given fiscal year.

## Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board:

- 1. Set the ad valorem tax millage for Fiscal Year 2024-2025 at the rolled-back rate of 0.0218 of a mill.
- 2. Approve the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Tentative Budget as presented, allow staff to make recommended adjustments and corrections, and submit the Standard Format Tentative Budget to the Governor's Office and Legislature by August 1, 2024.
- 3. Schedule the public hearings on the budget for Thursday, September 12, 2024, at 5:05 p.m. Eastern Time at District Headquarters in Havana, Florida and Thursday, September 26, 2024, at 5:05 p.m. Central Time in Panama City, Florida.

### **Background**

Pursuant to Chapter 373, Florida Statutes, the District is to submit the upcoming fiscal year's Tentative Budget by July 15 to the Governing Board for consideration followed by submittal to the Governor and Legislature by August 1. The Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025 Tentative Budget is based on the FY 2024-2025 Preliminary Budget, which was approved by the Governing Board on December 14, 2023. The attached spreadsheets provide budget summaries by revenues, expenditures, program, and fund.

Compared to the Preliminary Budget, if the Tentative Budget increases more than 25 percent in any Program, or the sum of expenditures for outreach, district management, and administration is more than 15 percent of the District's total annual budget, the Legislature has authority to object to the portion(s) that exceeds the thresholds. Program 3 exceeds this 25 percent threshold due to recently appropriated funds for \$2.5 million to support hurricane and tornado recovery efforts.

The Tentative Budget for FY 2024-2025 is \$113,605,532, a decrease of \$11,787,124 (9.4 percent) from the FY 2023-2024 Current-Amended Budget. The Tentative Budget prioritizes funding for water quality projects that will help maximize nutrient reductions, consistent with Executive Orders 19-12 and 23-06. Additionally, this budget continues funding priority projects and activities that are vital to support the District's core mission functions, including:

- \$50.9 million for Springs Projects. This funding will enable the District to implement restoration and protection projects for Wakulla Spring, Jackson Blue Spring, and springs associated with the St. Marks River, Chipola River, Econfina Creek, and Holmes Creek.
- \$19.2 million for alternative water supply development, water supply development assistance, and water resource development. Alternative water supply development funding includes support for cooperative, multijurisdictional efforts to expand reuse of reclaimed water in northwest Florida. Water resource development activities include water resources evaluations and hydrogeologic investigations, as well as continuing technical assistance for water use efficiency in the Jackson Blue Spring groundwater contribution area.
- \$6.7 million for watershed restoration. This funding will facilitate continued efforts to protect and restore water quality and aquatic habitats through cooperative water quality improvement projects and best management practices. Funded projects include stormwater retrofits and septic tank abatement benefitting St. Joseph and Apalachicola bays; a dedicated assessment of water quality and freshwater inflow in St. Joseph Bay; implementation of a pilot distributed wastewater grant program for impaired waterbodies; and an assessment of potential flooding impacts along select waterbodies in the St. Andrew Bay and Apalachicola River and Bay watersheds.
- \$5.1 million for land management and reforestation efforts. This funding will allow the District to develop additional recreational opportunities, enhance existing recreational sites for increased public use and safety, provide reforestation with prescribed burns and tree planting, and meet land management requirements on District mitigation lands.
- \$2.0 million for data collection and Minimum Flows and Minimum Water Levels technical assessments for Jackson Blue Spring; the Gainer Spring Group; Sylvan Spring Group; and Williford Spring Group; and the Floridan aquifer in coastal Bay County.
- \$10.0 million for hurricane and tornado recovery and waterway restoration.

Under Florida law and the state's constitution, the District is authorized to assess a millage rate of 0.0500 or less. The District will assess the current year aggregate rolled-back rate, which is the millage rate that would produce the same tax revenue as in the prior year, excluding some adjustments such as new construction. A millage rate higher than this rolled-back rate would constitute a tax increase. The District has prepared the FY 2024-2025 Tentative Budget using the rolled-back rate of 0.0218, which is 56.4 percent below the maximum authorized. Using the 2024 gross taxable value for operating purposes of \$193,460,880,875 and the proposed 0.0218 of a mill, the 2025 Truth-In-Millage (TRIM) estimated total taxes to be levied in FY 2024-2025 is \$4,217,447. Compared to the 2024 TRIM estimate of \$4,092,488, there is a \$124,959 or 3.1 percent increase in estimated tax revenues for the upcoming fiscal year. This tax data is based on property value estimates furnished by the 16 counties in the District. Because the District has historically collected slightly less than the amount estimated, ad valorem is budgeted at

\$4,025,000. This budgeted amount for FY 2024-2025 is 95.4 percent of the property appraiser estimate of \$4,217,447 and \$125,000 or 3.2 percent more than the amount budgeted in FY 2023-2024.

Proposed dates for the public hearings on the budget are Thursday, September 12, 2024, at 5:05 p.m. Eastern Time at District Headquarters in Havana, Florida, and Thursday, September 26, 2024, at 5:05 p.m. Central Time in Panama City, Florida.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Spending Authority for FY 2024-25 Hurricane and Tornado

Recovery and Restoration Activities

## Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to issue individual or cumulative task orders that exceed the delegated spending authority to current contractors deemed responsive to RFP 20-001 to facilitate continued hurricane and tornado recovery and restoration activities up to an amount not to exceed \$2,500,000 for Fiscal Year 2024-25, subject to approval of the Fiscal Year 2024-25 budget.

### **Background**

Since June of 2020, the Governing Board has approved approximately \$2,500,000 annually in spending authority for Hurricane Michael recovery efforts. The work has been completed through task orders assigned to contractors who were deemed responsive to RFP 20-001, and the work is awarded to the lowest bidder through a Request for Quote (RFQ) process.

To date, the District has spent more than \$9,000,000 on hurricane recovery efforts within the Econfina Creek, Apalachicola River, and Chipola River water management areas and has completed vegetative debris reduction and removal on thousands of acres. The District has also repaired more than 50 miles of roadways and repaired and reopened dozens of recreation areas for public use and enjoyment. As of today, there are no remaining recreation sites closures as a result of Hurricane Michael.

On June 13<sup>th</sup>, the Governing Board adopted Amendment No. 5 to the FY 2023-24 budget to increase spending authority and revenue by \$10,000,000 in state funding from the General Revenue Fund to manage hurricane and tornado recovery and restoration activities. These funds

may also be used for activities that reduce or prevent wildfire or flooding activities within areas impacted by Hurricane Michael.

At this time, staff is requesting the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to issue individual or cumulative task orders that exceed the delegated spending authority to current contractors deemed responsive to RFP 20-001 to facilitate continued recovery and restoration efforts on District lands, for Fiscal Year 2024-25, up to an amount not to exceed \$2,500,000.

### **Staff Recommendation**

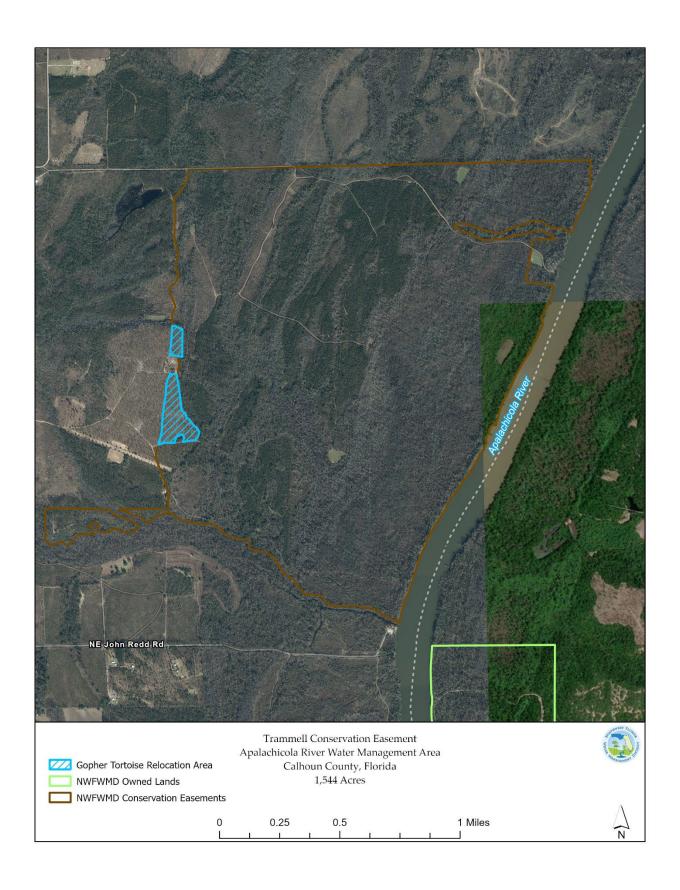
Staff recommends the Governing Board approve Amendment No. 2 to the Trammell Conservation Easement and authorize the Executive Director to sign Amendment No. 2, subject to legal counsel review and approval.

### **Background**

The District purchased a Conservation Easement on 1,544 acres in December 2007 from Mr. Robert Trammell et al. This property is located in Calhoun County and has approximately two miles of frontage along the west side of the Apalachicola River (see attached map).

Mr. Trammell's consultant, Mr. Will Leonard, approached District staff requesting Amendment No. 2 to this Conservation Easement to allow gopher tortoise relocation on to approximately 25 acres. If approved, 75 gopher tortoises could be relocated onto this 25-acre site generating \$262,500. According to Mr. Leonard, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission has verbally confirmed the site met their requirements pending the successful submission of the permit package and accompanying documentation.
