A person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's action may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) in accordance with Section 120.57, Florida Statutes (F.S.). The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000. Petitions filed by the permittee and the parties listed below must be filed within 21 days of receipt of this letter. Petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the permittee at the address indicated above at the time of filing. Failure to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any right such person may have to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Section 120.57, F.S.

The Petition shall contain the following information:

- (a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner, the permittee's name and address, the Department Permit File Number and the county in which the project is proposed;
- (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner's received notice of the Department's action or proposed action;
- (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Department's action; or proposed action;

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- (d) A statement of the material facts disputed by petitioner, if any;
- (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action;
- (f) A statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; and
- (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Department's action or proposed action.

If a petition is filed, the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate agency action. Accordingly, the Department's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this letter. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any decision of the Department with regard to the permit have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding. The petition must conform to the requirements specified above and be filed (received) within 21 days of receipt of this notice in the Office of General Counsel at the above address of the Department. Failure to petition within the allowed time frame constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to request a hearing under Section 120.57, F.S., and to participate as a party to this proceeding. Any subsequent intervention will only be at the approval of the presiding officer upon motion filed pursuant to Rule 28-5.207, F.A.C.

This Notice constitutes final agency action unless a petition is filed in accordance with the above paragraphs or unless a request for extension of time in which to file a petition is filed within the time specified for filing a petition. Upon timely filing of a petition or a request for an extension of time this Notice will not be effective until further Order of the Department.

Any party to this letter has the right to seek judicial review of the Order pursuant to Section 120.68, Florida Statutes, by the filing of a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the Clerk of the Department in the Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000; and by filing a copy with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date the Notice of Permit Modification is filed with the Clerk of the Department.

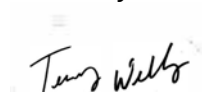

A PERMIT AUTHORIZING:

This is a minor modification to change the mitigation bank conditions associated with the previously permitted activity. The previously authorized activities have not changed which consist of the construction of surface water management systems designed to provide treatment and attenuation for a new north/south roadway alignment in the western portion of Crestview, (Okaloosa County). This roadway alignment will consist of a 4-lane divided roadway with portions equipped with a curb and gutter system and other portions equipped with paved shoulders sloped toward roadside conveyance swales, and a bridge crossing at Trammel Creek. Each of the conveyance systems are designed to route stormwater runoff toward one of the eight stormwater management systems. The project has been divided into eight hydraulically separate drainage basins each consisting of wet detention systems (BP-1, BP-2, BP-3A, BP-3, BP-4, BP-5, BP-6, and BP-7) designed without littoral zones and discharge toward adjacent wetlands throughout the project area. Please refer to Plan Sheets 133 through 149 for pond specific information such as proposed elevations, grading, and associated details of the control structures. Portions of this roadway alignment overlap with the East-West Connector Road (IND-091-292254-1) and provide treatment and attenuation for the designated drainage basins. The permit authorizes direct permanent impacts to wetlands and other surface waters over an area of approximately 1.61 acres, which includes shade and fill impacts. Impacts to wetlands will be offset through the purchase of wetland mitigation credits from Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank. No construction is authorized until the mitigation credits have been purchased or a suitable alternative compensatory mitigation plan has been approved through a modification of this permit. The surface water management system is in accordance with the approved plans and supporting drainage report prepared by HDR Engineering, Inc.

CONDITIONS FOR ISSUANCE OF PERMIT NUMBER IND-091-292252-2
Crestview Bypass Phase V
DATED June 15, 2021

1. All activities shall be implemented following the plans, specifications and performance criteria approved by this permit. Any deviations must be authorized in a permit modification in accordance with Rule 62-330.315, F.A.C. Any deviations that are not so authorized may subject the permittee to enforcement action and revocation of the permit under Chapter 373, F.S.
2. A complete copy of this permit shall be kept at the work site of the permitted activity during the construction phase, and shall be available for review at the work site upon request by the Agency staff. The permittee shall require the contractor to review the complete permit prior to beginning construction.
3. Activities shall be conducted in a manner that does not cause or contribute to violations of state water quality standards. Performance-based erosion and sediment control best management practices shall be installed immediately prior to, and be maintained during and after construction as needed, to prevent adverse impacts to the water resources and adjacent lands. Such practices shall be in accordance with the *State of Florida Erosion and Sediment Control Designer and Reviewer Manual (Florida Department of Environmental Protection and Florida Department of Transportation June 2007)*, and the *Florida Stormwater Erosion and Sedimentation Control Inspector's Manual (Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Nonpoint Source Management Section, Tallahassee, Florida, July 2008)*, which are both incorporated by reference in subparagraph 62-330.050(9)(b)5., F.A.C., unless a project-specific erosion and sediment control plan is approved or other water quality control measures are required as part of the permit.
4. At least 48 hours prior to beginning the authorized activities, the permittee shall submit to the Agency a fully executed Form 62-330.350(1), "Construction Commencement Notice," [October 1, 2013], incorporated by reference herein (<http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-02505>), indicating the expected start and completion dates. A copy of this form may be obtained from the Agency, as described in subsection 62-330.010(5), F.A.C. If available, an Agency website that fulfills this notification requirement may be used in lieu of the form.
5. Unless the permit is transferred under Rule 62-330.340, F.A.C., or transferred to an operating entity under Rule 62-330.310, F.A.C., the permittee is liable to comply with the plans, terms and conditions of the permit for the life of the project or activity.
6. Within 30 days after completing construction of the entire project, or any independent portion of the project, the permittee shall provide the following to the Agency, as applicable:
 1. For an individual, private single-family residential dwelling unit, duplex, triplex, or quadruplex – "Construction Completion and Inspection Certification for Activities Associated With a Private Single-Family Dwelling Unit" [Form 62-330.310(3)]; or
 2. For all other activities – "As-Built Certification and Request for Conversion to Operational Phase" [Form 62-330.310(1)].
 3. If available, an Agency website that fulfills this certification requirement may be used in lieu of the form.

7. If the final operation and maintenance entity is a third party:
 1. Prior to sales of any lot or unit served by the activity and within one year of permit issuance, or within 30 days of as- built certification, whichever comes first, the permittee shall submit, as applicable, a copy of the operation and maintenance documents (see sections 12.3 thru 12.3.3 of Volume I) as filed with the Department of State, Division of Corporations and a copy of any easement, plat, or deed restriction needed to operate or maintain the project, as recorded with the Clerk of the Court in the County in which the activity is located.
 2. Within 30 days of submittal of the as- built certification, the permittee shall submit "Request for Transfer of Environmental Resource Permit to the Perpetual Operation Entity" [Form 62-330.310(2)] to transfer the permit to the operation and maintenance entity, along with the documentation requested in the form. If available, an Agency website that fulfills this transfer requirement may be used in lieu of the form.
8. The permittee shall notify the Agency in writing of changes required by any other regulatory agency that require changes to the permitted activity, and any required modification of this permit must be obtained prior to implementing the changes.
9. This permit does not:
 1. Convey to the permittee any property rights or privileges, or any other rights or privileges other than those specified herein or in Chapter 62-330, F.A.C.;
 2. Convey to the permittee or create in the permittee any interest in real property;
 3. Relieve the permittee from the need to obtain and comply with any other required federal, state, and local authorization, law, rule, or ordinance; or
 4. Authorize any entrance upon or work on property that is not owned, held in easement, or controlled by the permittee
10. Prior to conducting any activities on state-owned submerged lands or other lands of the state, title to which is vested in the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund, the permittee must receive all necessary approvals and authorizations under Chapters 253 and 258, F.S. Written authorization that requires formal execution by the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund shall not be considered received until it has been fully executed.
11. The permittee shall hold and save the Agency harmless from any and all damages, claims, or liabilities that may arise by reason of the construction, alteration, operation, maintenance, removal, abandonment or use of any project authorized by the permit.
12. The permittee shall notify the Agency in writing:
 1. Immediately if any previously submitted information is discovered to be inaccurate; and
 2. Within 30 days of any conveyance or division of ownership or control of the property or the system, other than conveyance via a long-term lease, and the new owner shall request transfer of the permit in accordance with Rule 62-330.340, F.A.C. This does not apply to the sale of lots or units in residential or commercial subdivisions or condominiums where the stormwater management system has been completed and converted to the operation phase
13. Upon reasonable notice to the permittee, Agency staff with proper identification shall have permission to enter, inspect, sample and test the project or activities to ensure conformity with the plans and specifications authorized in the permit.

14. If any prehistoric or historic artifacts, such as pottery or ceramics, stone tools or metal implements, dugout canoes, or any other physical remains that could be associated with Native American cultures, or early colonial or American settlement are encountered at any time within the project site area, work involving subsurface disturbance in the immediate vicinity of such discoveries shall cease. The permittee or other designee shall contact the Florida Department of State, Division of Historical Resources, Compliance and Review Section, at (850) 245-6333 or (800) 847-7278, as well as the appropriate permitting agency office. Such subsurface work shall not resume without verbal or written authorization from the Division of Historical Resources. If unmarked human remains are encountered, all work shall stop immediately and notification shall be provided in accordance with Section 872.05, F.S.
15. Any delineation of the extent of a wetland or other surface water submitted as part of the permit application, including plans or other supporting documentation, shall not be considered binding unless a specific condition of this permit or a formal determination under Rule 62-330.201, F.A.C., provides otherwise.
16. The permittee shall provide routine maintenance of all components of the stormwater management system to remove trapped sediments and debris. Removed materials shall be disposed of in a landfill or other uplands in a manner that does not require a permit under Chapter 62-330, F.A.C., or cause violations of state water quality standards.
17. This permit is issued based on the applicant's submitted information that reasonably demonstrates that adverse water resource-related impacts will not be caused by the completed permit activity. If any adverse impacts result, the Agency will require the permittee to eliminate the cause, obtain any necessary permit modification, and take any necessary corrective actions to resolve the adverse impacts.
18. A Recorded Notice of Environmental Resource Permit may be recorded in the county public records in accordance with subsection 62-330.090(7), F.A.C. Such notice is not an encumbrance upon the property.
19. Record-keeping. The permittee shall be responsible for keeping records documenting that relevant permit conditions are met. This documentation shall include, at a minimum, the date of each inspection, the name and qualifications of the inspector, any maintenance actions taken, and a determination by the inspector as to whether the system is operating as intended. Inspection documentation must be readily available and shall be submitted annually to the District by the anniversary date of the permit.
20. Once project construction has been deemed complete, including the re-stabilization of all side slopes, embankments, and other disturbed areas, and before the transfer to the Operation and Maintenance phase, all obsolete erosion control materials shall be removed.
21. The wet detention area shall be inspected periodically for debris and trash built up around the discharge structures. Accumulations of debris and trash that negatively affect the function of the system shall be removed upon discovery.
22. Inspections by a Registered Professional. The stormwater management system shall be inspected by a registered professional to evaluate whether the system is functioning as designed and permitted. The Registered Professional may record his inspection on Form No 62-330.311(1), Operation and Maintenance Inspection Certification or may provide his evaluation in any other format; however any report must be signed and sealed by the Registered Professional. Submittal of the

inspection report to the District shall occur within 30 days of the inspection. Inspections shall be made by the Registered Professional in accordance with this schedule:

- On the first anniversary of the date of conversion to Operation and Maintenance Phase.
- Every fifth year on the anniversary of conversion to Operation and Maintenance phase, after the first year of successful operation.

23. Reporting by a Registered Professional. Within 30 days of any failure of the stormwater management system or deviation from the permit, a report shall be submitted to the District on Form 62-330.311(1), Operation and Maintenance Inspection Certification, describing the remedial actions taken to resolve the failure or deviation. This report shall be signed and sealed by a Registered Professional.
24. All storage or stockpiling of tools or materials (i.e. lumber, pilings, etc.) shall be limited to uplands or within the impact areas authorized by this project. In addition, all equipment being utilized shall be limited to operation and storage in uplands or within the impact areas authorized by this permit.
25. Prior to construction, the limits of the proposed construction shall be demarcated (clearly flagged and/or staked): particularly in areas adjacent to remaining natural wetlands. All construction personnel shall be shown the location(s) of all wetland areas outside of the construction area so as to prevent encroachment from heavy equipment into these areas.
26. The Permittee and its contractors shall adhere to the standard specifications for prevention, control and abatement of erosion and water pollution, as stated in the Florida Erosion and Sediment Control Designer and Reviewer Manual (FDOT and FDEP, 2007), and to any stricter standards required in this permit. The contractors shall be responsible for ensuring that turbidity/erosion control devices and procedures are inspected and maintained daily during all phases of construction authorized by this permit until all area that are disturbed during construction are sufficiently stabilized to prevent erosion, siltation, and turbid discharges.
27. Construction and operation is prohibited until the District has received proof of final purchase and sale of no less than 1.0 Freshwater Mixed Hardwoods credits from Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank. If for whatever reason, the proposed mitigation credit purchase cannot be completed, the applicant shall submit an application for a modification to this permit to address impacts to wetlands and other surface waters for which no mitigation has been provided. This application shall be submitted to the appropriate Water Management District office.
28. This permit does not authorize the permittee to cause any adverse impact to or “take” of state listed species and other regulated species of fish and wildlife. Compliance with state laws regulating the take of fish and wildlife is the responsibility of the owner or applicant associated with this project. Please refer to Chapter 68A-27 of the Florida Administrative Code for definitions of “take” and a list of fish and wildlife species. If listed species are observed onsite, FWC staff are available to provide decision support information or assist in obtaining the appropriate FWC permits. Most marine endangered and threatened species are statutorily protected and a “take” permit cannot be issued. Requests for further information or review can be sent to FWCConservationPlanningServices@MyFWC.com.
29. Negative impacts to wetlands or other surface waters outside of the approved impact area shall be reported immediately to the Northwest Florida Water Management District, 700 South U.S. Highway 331, DeFuniak Springs, FL 32435, Phone: (850) 951-

4660. Corrective action shall be taken as soon as practicable to restore the impacted areas.

The following information addresses procedures to be followed if you desire an administrative hearing or other review of agency action.

PETITION FOR FORMAL ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

Any person whose substantial interests are or may be affected by the action described in the enclosed Notice of Agency Action, may petition for an administrative hearing in accordance with the requirements of section 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, or may choose to pursue mediation as an alternative remedy under section 120.573, Florida Statutes, before the deadline for filing a petition. Pursuit of mediation will not adversely affect the right to administrative proceedings in the event mediation does not result in a settlement. Petitions for an administrative hearing must be filed with the Agency Clerk of the Northwest Florida Water Management District, 81 Water Management Drive, Havana, Florida 32333-9700 by the deadline specified in the attached cover letter. Failure to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any rights such person may have to request an administrative determination (hearing) under section 120.57, Florida Statutes, concerning the subject permit application. Petitions which are not filed in accordance with the above provisions are subject to dismissal.

DISTRICT COURT OF APPEAL

A party who is adversely affected by final agency action on the permit application and who has exhausted available administrative remedies is entitled to judicial review in the District Court of Appeal pursuant to section 120.68, Florida Statutes. Review under section 120.68, Florida Statutes, is initiated by filing a Notice of Appeal in the appropriate District Court of Appeal in accordance with Florida Rule of Appellate Procedure 9.110.

SECTION 28-106.201, FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, INITIATION OF PROCEEDINGS

- (1) Unless otherwise provided by statute, and except for agency enforcement and disciplinary actions that shall be initiated under Rule 28-106.2015, F.A.C., initiation of proceedings shall be made by written petition to the agency responsible for rendering final agency action. The term "petition" includes any document that requests an evidentiary proceeding and asserts the existence of a disputed issue of material fact. Each petition shall be legible and on 8 1/2 by 11 inch white paper. Unless printed, the impression shall be on one side of the paper only and lines shall be double-spaced.
- (2) All petitions filed under these rules shall contain:
 - (a) The name and address of each agency affected and each agency's file or identification number, if known;
 - (b) The name, address, any e-mail address, any facsimile number, and telephone number of the petitioner, if the petitioner is not represented by an attorney or a qualified representative; the name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; and an explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination;
 - (c) A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the agency decision;
 - (d) A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate;
 - (e) A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action;
 - (f) A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action, including an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes; and
 - (g) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agency's proposed action.
- (3) Upon receipt of a petition involving disputed issues of material fact, the agency shall grant or deny the petition, and if granted shall, unless otherwise provided by law, refer the matter to the Division of Administrative Hearings with a request that an administrative law judge be assigned to conduct the hearing. The request shall be accompanied by a copy of the petition and a copy of the notice of agency action.

NOTICING PUBLICATION INFORMATION

The District's action regarding the issuance or denial of a permit, a petition or qualification for an exemption only becomes closed to future legal challenges from members of the public ("third parties"), if 1) "third parties" have been properly notified of the District's action regarding the permit or exemption, and 2) no "third party" objects to the District's action within a specific period of time following the notification.

Notification of "third parties" is provided through publication of certain information in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where the proposed activities are to occur. Publication of notice informs "third parties" of their right to have a 21-day time limit in which to file a petition opposing the District's action. However, if no notice to "third parties" is published, there is no time limit to a party's right to challenge the District's action. The District has not published a notice to "third parties" that it has taken final action on your application. Notice is given that Environmental Resource permit number IND-091-292252-2 was issued on June 15, 2021 to Scott Bitterman of Okaloosa County for the construction of a new surface water management system designed to provide treatment and attenuation for a new north/south roadway alignment in the western portion of Crestview, (Okaloosa County). This is a minor modification to change the previously approved mitigation bank. The original project design and authorized work has not changed which will consist of a 4-lane divided roadway with portions equipped with a curb and gutter system and other portions equipped with paved shoulders sloped toward roadside conveyance swales. Each of the conveyance systems are designed to route stormwater runoff toward one of the stormwater management systems. The project has been divided into eight hydraulically separate drainage basins each consisting of wet detention systems designed without littoral zones and that discharge toward adjacent wetlands throughout the project area. The project includes direct permanent impacts to wetlands and other surface waters over an area of approximately 1.61 acres, which includes shade and fill impacts. Impacts to wetlands will be offset through the purchase of wetland mitigation credits from Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank. The project is located at West of SR 85 between I-10 and US 90, Okaloosa County.

Petitions must comply with the requirements of Florida Administrative Code, Chapter 28-106 and be filed with (received by) the District Clerk located at District Headquarters, 81 Water Management Drive, Havana, FL 32333-4712. Petitions for administrative hearing on the above application must be filed within twenty-one (21) days of publication of this notice or within twenty-six (26) days of the District depositing notice of this intent in the mail for those persons to whom the District mails actual notice. Failure to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any right(s) such person(s) may have to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., concerning the subject permit. Petitions which are not filed in accordance with the above provisions are subject to dismissal.

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filing of a petition means that the District's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this notice. 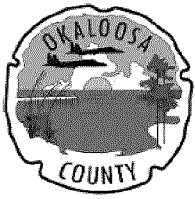

STATEMENT OF ISSUE: Phase V of the County's Southwest Crestview Bypass Project will impact wetlands with its construction. The County must mitigate those impacts as a condition of permit issuance from environmental permitting agencies.

BACKGROUND: Phase V of the SW Crestview Bypass project will impact wetlands. During the design and permitting process, it became apparent that the timing for purchasing credits from the Gin Hole Mitigation Bank was going to be lengthy, and ultimately untenable for timely completion of the project. This led staff and the consultant to begin exploring other options. Ultimately, with cooperation from District 3 Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) and the Northwest Florida Water management District (NFWMD), the purchase of credits from a mitigation bank outside the Yellow River watershed was authorized.

Appropriate credits were deemed available in the Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank in Washington County. Purchase of 1.00 state Freshwater Mixed Hardwoods Mitigation Credits and 1.11 federal Palustrine Forested Wetland Mitigation Credits from the Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank, for Phase V of the Southwest Crestview Bypass, will allow the County's issuance of a Notice to Proceed for Phase V of the project, and opens the path for immediate commencement of construction of the largest portion of the Southwest Crestview Bypass project.

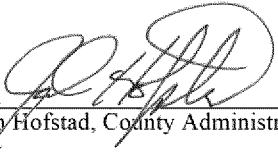
The East-West connector portion of the SW Crestview Bypass project has more substantial wetland impacts that require more robust permitting processes, and is therefore not included in this mitigation agreement. However, that portion of the project is very close to approval, is on a similar track for Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank credits, and is expected to be completed within the next few weeks. The purchase of the credits will be paid for from the bond issuance proceeds established for Southwest Crestview Bypass improvements.

CREDIT RESERVATION AND PURCHASE AGREEMENT**

The Northwest Florida Water Management District, a Florida governmental agency and owner of the land which constitutes the Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank (hereinafter referred to as "Seller") does hereby reserve and set aside for future assignment for the sole benefit of Okaloosa County (hereinafter referred to as "Buyer"), a total of 1.00 state Freshwater Mixed Hardwoods Mitigation Credits and 1.11 federal Palustrine Forested Wetland Mitigation Credits issued to Seller's Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank pursuant to Seller's mitigation banking permits from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP Permit 0227351-001) and the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE Permit SAI-2002-5061 NW-DEB).

This reservation is for use of credit in connection with mitigating adverse wetland impacts which may arise as a result of construction or other projects undertaken or to be undertaken by the Buyer (State 404 Permit ST404-0396393-001-SFG/46; NFWFMD ERP Permit IND-091-292252-2). Seller warrants that it will take no action inconsistent with the reservation and future assignment described herein.

Seller is committed to transfer to Buyer 1.00 state mitigation credits and 1.11 federal mitigation credits from its mitigation bank in Washington County for use in offsetting wetland impacts upon receipt of the full Purchase Price. The Purchase Price for 1.00 state credits and 1.11 federal credits is one hundred ninety-seven thousand eight hundred ninety-eight dollars and no cents (\$197,898.00).

Upon receipt of the total Purchase Price for the credit, Seller will send a Request for Withdrawal of Mitigation Credits to FDEP and the USACE requesting FDEP and USACE to withdraw the specified credit from the Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank upon approval of the Buyer's permits.

Failure by the Buyer to close the purchase within ninety (90) days of the execution of this Agreement shall be a default of this Agreement, permitting termination of this Agreement by Seller unless an extension is granted in writing by mutual consent of both parties.

23. Reporting by a Registered Professional. Within 30 days of any failure of the stormwater management system or deviation from the permit, a report shall be submitted to the District on Form 62-330.311(1), Operation and Maintenance Inspection Certification, describing the remedial actions taken to resolve the failure or deviation. This report shall be signed and sealed by a Registered Professional.
24. All storage or stockpiling of tools or materials (i.e. lumber, pilings, etc.) shall be limited to uplands or within the impact areas authorized by this project. In addition, all equipment being utilized shall be limited to operation and storage in uplands or within the impact areas authorized by this permit.
25. Prior to construction, the limits of the proposed construction shall be demarcated (clearly flagged and/or staked): particularly in areas adjacent to remaining natural wetlands. All construction personnel shall be shown the location(s) of all wetland areas outside of the construction area so as to prevent encroachment from heavy equipment into these areas.
26. The Permittee and its contractors shall adhere to the standard specifications for prevention, control and abatement of erosion and water pollution, as stated in the Florida Erosion and Sediment Control Designer and Reviewer Manual (FDOT and FDEP, 2007), and to any stricter standards required in this permit. The contractors shall be responsible for ensuring that turbidity/erosion control devices and procedures are inspected and maintained daily during all phases of construction authorized by this permit until all area that are disturbed during construction are sufficiently stabilized to prevent erosion, siltation, and turbid discharges.
27. Construction and operation is prohibited until the District has received proof of final purchase and sale of no less than 1.0 Freshwater Mixed Hardwoods credits from Sand Hill Lakes Mitigation Bank. If for whatever reason, the proposed mitigation credit purchase cannot be completed, the applicant shall submit an application for a modification to this permit to address impacts to wetlands and other surface waters for which no mitigation has been provided. This application shall be submitted to the appropriate Water Management District office.
28. This permit does not authorize the permittee to cause any adverse impact to or “take” of state listed species and other regulated species of fish and wildlife. Compliance with state laws regulating the take of fish and wildlife is the responsibility of the owner or applicant associated with this project. Please refer to Chapter 68A-27 of the Florida Administrative Code for definitions of “take” and a list of fish and wildlife species. If listed species are observed onsite, FWC staff are available to provide decision support information or assist in obtaining the appropriate FWC permits. Most marine endangered and threatened species are statutorily protected and a “take” permit cannot be issued.
